### Full text of the letter written to MD & CEO :

“ We have come across with the following message from the Bank in connection with the unprecedented natural calamity in the State of Kerala:

*“We have a branch named Kadamakudy, in an island where about 300 families reside. All families are evacuated. Houses including our branch is submerged. We have planned to adopt the island and provide all basic necessities with our Fund. The activities will start as soon as the floods recede.”*

The message itself is the manifestation of the fact that Union Bank of India stands with the people of Kerala and it does not require any further description to convince the Management about the sufferings. All the employees of the Bank are definitely proud of their beloved Institution for such a stand. Our Unit in Kerala, Union Bank of India Employees Federation (Kerala), through its letter dated 14.08.2018 requested the General Manager (HR) for permitting the employees to donate one day's salary towards Chief Minister Relief Fund in Kerala by encashing P/L and also to sanction interest free flood advance to the flood affected employees of the Bank. Our

Unit has not yet received any response from him. We now request you kindly to look into the matter and accord your immediate sanction to the following :

- 1) Allow all the employees of the Bank to donate minimum one day's salary to Chief Minister Relief Fund in Kerala through encashment of P/L.
- 2) Disbursement of salary for the current month in advance.
- 3) Interest free flood advance to the flood affected employees.
- 4) Treat the absence from branch/office on account of devastating flood as special leave.

We hope to receive a positive response from your end.”
